Crickets



70 - 75



Offer Cricket Power Food and Easy Water or Cricket Aid daily.

Keep enclosure clean and avoid high moisture, direct sunlight and chemicals.



Reptile Lunch Boxes are pre-packaged with a food and water source and require no maintenance.

Superworms



70 - 75



Mealworm bedding is the ideal media for storage and is also the worm's food source.

Add Easy Water or Cricket Aid every few days. **DO NOT REFRIGERATE.**

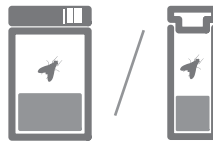


Cupped Superworms require very little maintenance. Adding a small form of moisture like Cricket Aid weekly is beneficial.

Flightless Fruit Flies



70 - 75



Food is present in the jars or vials that will sustain several generations of flies.

Half of the flies must remain in the vial or jar for continued reproduction.



Melanogaster fruit flies reproduce much quicker than the Hydei. The Melanogaster life cycle is approx. 12-15 days versus 25 days for the Hydei.

Waxworms



50 - 55



Waxworms no longer eat and require no additional care.

The door of the fridge is the warmest and best place for waxworm storage.



Cupped Waxworms are packed in aspen chips and will last for more than two weeks at the correct temperature.

Calciworms



42 - 55



Calciworms are packed with their food source and require no maintenance.

Healthy Calciworms vary in color from milky white to black.



When kept at room temperature Calciworms generate waste with a strong ammonia smell - that's why they are best kept in the refrigerator.

Mealworms



42 - 55



Mealworm bedding is the ideal media for storage and is also the worm's food source.

Remove worms from fridge and add Easy Water. Allow to remain at room temperature for 24 hours before returning to fridge.



Cupped Mealworms are packed in mealworms bedding and require very little maintenance.

Hornworms



70 - 75



Enough food is present in the cups to grow the worms into adulthood.

Remove cup lid daily to remove waste.



Hornworms grow quickly and are voracious eaters. As a result they produce a lot of waste. Keeping the cup clean will improve insect health.

COLD WEATHER SHIPPING

Crickets will often appear dead when shipped in cold weather conditions. If a bulk cricket order appears normal but lifeless, remove the crickets from the cardboard box and place into a container that provides good airflow. Keep crickets at room temperature and allow to warm for 3-4 hours.
